The first car took to the road on 9th July 2007, it was a large old Peugeot Estate loaned to the club by one of the members. There were 4 initial members.

In January 2008 we had 10 members and took on a second car, a Ford Focus estate.

We now have 45 members and 3 cars:

2. Ford Focus estate; on loan from a member and
3. Renault Clio hatchback purchased by the club in August 2011.

The club is run by a committee of volunteers on behalf of the members. A part-time paid coordinator is responsible for the day to day running of the club.

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Llanidloes and District Car Club



Car sharing for people in the Llanidloes Area

Llani car club is a community run car sharing scheme, where people share the use and cost of running of cars.

Why would I want to join?

The benefits can be:

- Reduce your costs, the main costs of a car are the hidden costs such as insurance, tax, depreciation and maintenance, these are paid for by the club.
- Reduce your carbon footprint, most members report a reduction in car use because it makes them think about their travelling needs much more.
- No need to own a second vehicle

Are there any age restrictions on the insurance?

Our insurance will cover most people aged 25 and over providing you have never had drinking driving conviction.

How do I book the car?

By phone or using the internet.

How much does it cost?

35p per mile for the first 150 miles in a booking, it then drops to 30p per mile. This includes everything, even the fuel. There is also a minimum charge of 45 miles per day excluding the first day which has no minimum.

Do I have to pay for fuel?

Yes, the car should be returned with the tank at least ½ full. You need to get a receipt for it so that it can be credited to your account.

How do I join?

Initially contact Andrew - details on the back of this leaflet, then:

- Read and sign the members agreement form.
- Pay a refundable deposit of £100 to cover the insurance excess
- You will be shown the procedure of how to book, collect and return a car.

What if a car breaks down?

We have full breakdown and recovery cover. Details are kept in each car.

What if I have an accident?

Procedure is exactly the same as if it were your own car. If we have to pay the £100 excess, you will forfeit your deposit. You will have to pay another £100 before you can continue to be a member.

Who is responsible for maintenance?

We pay a local professional mechanic to check the tyre pressures and fluid levels every month. The cars also undergo 6 and 12 monthly services. If you notice any problems while using a car, details need to be written in the car's record book. In the case of major issues the coordinator must also be informed.

What if there is no car available when I need one?

Either you can contact the coordinator or the members directly to see if there is some flexibility.

What if I want to leave the club?

You will need to settle any outstanding bills and your deposit will be returned to you.
